

- Continuation of the agricultural European Innovation Partnership
- Strengthening of the Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System

- Each CAP strategic plan will include a section on how to stimulate the exchange of knowledge and innovation & the development of digital technologies in agriculture
- Advice, training, innovation and knowledge support in Rural Development
- Specific budget of EUR 10 billion in Horizon Europe for agriculture, food, bioeconomy and rural development

The AKIS at the heart of the agricultural innovation ecosystem

What is an Agricultural Knowledge and Innovation System (AKIS)?

What:

AKIS is the organisation and interaction of persons, organisations and institutions who use and produce knowledge and innovation for agriculture and interrelated fields.

Who:

The main players of the AKIS are: farmers, advisors, researchers, (farmer) organisations, retailers, media, services, ministries...: they all produce and need knowledge!

Why:

The aim is to create an innovation ecosystem by enhancing knowledge flows between the AKIS players as well as strengthening links between research and practice.



The « innovation dimension » of the future CAP network



Mission	« A platform providing for more exchange of knowledge in order to capture the results and added value of the policy at European level, particularly the Horizon Europe policy »
Members	« Network of organisations and administrations, advisors, researchers and other innovation actors in the field of agriculture and rural development »
Objectives	« Fostering innovation and supporting the inclusion of all stakeholders in the knowledge-exchange and knowledge-building process »
Tasks	«Collection of information and facilitation of networking of funded structures and projects, such as [] Operational Groups
Link with EIP Operational Groups	« Operational Groups shall disseminate their plans and the results of their projects, in particular through the CAP networks »
One of the three pillars of the AKIS	« Advisory services, research and CAP networks will work together within the framework of the AKIS »









protect the










Les principales thématiques des GO

Thématiques traitées (échantillon 600 GO de 14 EM)












Les GO selon le secteur d'activité
